Participants register in advance via email (outreach@placerrep.org) for a presentation slot, and may try out new material, share a new work, hone their performance or presentation skills, seek collaborators, market themselves or their group, and may choose to receive feedback from attendees. Creatives and cultural

advocates come together to incubate new works and ideas in an open and supportive atmosphere.

As an educator, she has instructed and directed at UC Davis, University of San Francisco, University of Minnesota and other educational institutions. Projects on which Forsyth worked performed at

venues such as the Kennedy Center, the Smithsonian, Dallas Theatre Center, San Diego Repertory Theater and many other renown venues, and received Dramalogue Awards, Critics Circle Awards, Indy Award: Best Spoken Word Album, as well as numerous grants from the NEA, NEH, CAC and corporations. She is a member of the professional organizations: The Dramatists Guild, The Association for Theatre in Higher Education (ATHE), TCG and NNPN/New Play Exchange.

He began training in acting at UC Davis while earning his B.A. in Music Performance. After graduating, he performed at Davis Musical Theater Company in *Peter Pan, The King and I, Damn Yankees*, and the Elly Award winning production of *Chicago*. His other credits include *The Importance of Being Earnest* at Chautauqua Playhouse and *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum* at Sacramento Theater company, where he taught youth classes through the School Partnership Program, and now teaches Musical Theater at Rockstar Music Academy, as well as adult courses through the Placer Rep Performing Arts Preparatory Education program. Kevin stars as Dr. Watson in the audience favorite

"Sherlock Holmes: Domestic Mysteries series," as well as playing Mr. Charles Musgrove in Placer Rep's holiday play, Persuasion. He is currently developing his solo show for preview this winter, and world premiere in 2022.

Mindy Cooper, Co-Founder of Catalyst: A Theatre Think Tank and a veteran of the Broadway community for over 30 years, has always led with her passion for new works. As a Director, Choreographer and performer on Broadway and Off-Broadway- Chicago (Original Revival Cast), Titanic (Original Cast), Dracula The Musical, Wrong Mountain, Beauty and the Beast, Song & Dance, 50 Shades The Musical Parody, The Eternal Space, Mars/Venus Live, Soul Doctor, Five Course Love, Hoi Polloi, Being Seen (FringeNYC) and Deployed (NYMF). Readings, Commissions and World Premieres- Mothers (NNPN), Social Life the Musical, American Monkey, Still Will Be Heard (Peak Performances), My Friend Hafiz (SF Mission), and Mojave The Musical. Her regional work has won multiple Bay Area Theater Critics Awards and Theatre Bay Area Awards. She is a Professor of Theatre at UC Davis.

DR. LISA QUORESIMO -- Director, Performer, Playwright, Composer



Dr. Lisa Quoresimo, a director, performer, playwright and composer, is Assistant Professor of Musical Theatre at Southern Utah University. She is directing several projects this season with Catalyst: A Theatre Think Tank, including *Juliet & Romeo*, a new musical by Tonynominated composer Paul Gordon and Emmy-nominated composer Curtis Moore. Lisa's work as a performer and composer has been seen most recently in the SF Bay Area at Berkeley Rep, Shotgun Players, Brava Theatre, and the Davis Shakespeare Festival. As the artistic director of the Kairos Theatre in NYC, Lisa produced and directed upwards of thirty shows. Her vocal students have been seen on Broadway, national tours, and in the Vienna Boys Choir. She has served on the faculties of NYU and the Manhattan School of Music. Her scholarly work has been published in *Theatre Topics, Frontiers: A*

Journal of Women Studies and Analog Game Studies, and she has a forthcoming chapter in Hamilton: History, Hip-Hop and Politics: Essays on the Afterbirth of a Nation. Lisa holds a Ph.D. in Performance Studies from UC Davis.

ANNE MERINO – Novelist, Screenwriter, Adjunct Faculty, Artistic Director of Placer Theatre Ballet



Merino began her career dancing for notable companies such as American Ballet Theatre and the London Festival Ballet and is currently the artistic director of Placer Theatre Ballet. A prolific choreographer, she won the Vanguard Award for Choreography. Merino's traditional theatrical training was received at Chicago's Goodman Theatre, Second City with Del Close and John Belushi and later trained under Alan Rickman at the British American Drama Academy. As an actress, Ms. Merino performed with The Groundlings and Tim Robbins' The Actors' Gang, is on the Theater department faculty at William Jessup University. Her screenplay, A Season for Wolves, recently won the Critics' Choice award at the Madras Film Festival.
