Transport Back in Time at The Jane Austen Soiree holiday event

Sweep back to the time of Jane Austen on Saturday, December 11 at the Lincoln Civic Auditorium and sample the delights of the Regency period at *The Jane Austen Soiree*. The Rockstar Music Academy and Placer Repertory Theater present a holiday event: *The Jane Austen Soiree* at which audiences are encouraged to arrive early, dressed inspired by the period, to enjoy refreshments, listen to the music, and watch or join in the 'contra dance' just like in a Jane Austen film. Patrons will hear fascinating historical information and social graces of the period from the Event Social Director/Hostess Crystal Neher-Evans and may participate in the audience costume parade at intermission or win goodie baskets from local merchants and makers. The main feature of the evening is its entertainment: top-notch professional actors perform the stage-reading of *Persuasion: a holiday romantic comedy*, inspired by the Jane Austen novel, at 2 p.m. and 7 p.m., which includes a post-show Q&A to meet the actors, playwright, and the creative team.

The play is set in England in 1814 and the entire second act takes place during the winter holiday season in Bath, ending with a Christmas Party that defines the characters' fates. The story follows Miss Anne Elliot who spent the last 8 years dutiful and depressed amongst her comically dysfunctional family and social circle, since she was persuaded by her father and Lady Russell to break her engagement to Commander Wentworth. But now the love of her life returns from the war a wealthy Captain. Will she successfully persuade her social circle to accept Captain Wentworth – assuming she can help him overcome his bitterness, or shall she marry a charming gentleman she meets in Bath, who makes his interest abundantly clear at a Holiday concert? "This play is full of rich, eccentric characters and a surprising amount of action, which makes it the perfect holiday treat for the whole family," said playwright T.S. Forsyth.

The Jane Austen Soiree is the second milestone event of the Placer Rep Educational Outreach Program to middle and high school students, partnered with the Rocklin Friends of the Library, and a proof-point showing students how they may find their passion and be inspired by reading and engaging with the many resources and programs available to them at their local branch of the Placer County Library system, under the skilled direction of Mary George, Placer County Library Director.

The Jane Austen Soiree is sponsored by Armrod Charitable Trust, Arts Council of Placer County, The Rockstar Music Academy and private donors. 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

Most recently for Placer Repertory Theater, she is the playwright/director for *Sherlock Holmes: The Sign of the Four* and *Persuasion: a holiday romantic comedy*, co-author / dramaturg / director and actor mentor for *My Jekyll & Hyde*. and was the director / dramaturg / playwriting mentor for *New Beginnings: the new play about the historic Placer County Roundhouses*. She is a member of the professional organizations: The Dramatists Guild, The Association for Theatre in Higher Education (ATHE), TCG and NNPN/New Play Exchange.



BLAIR HARTMAN – Program Operations Manager, Stage Manager

Roseville resident Blair Hartman is a graduate of Allegheny College with a BA in Theater and a demonstrated history of working in the performing arts on both east and west coasts. RODGER MCDONALD – Sir Walter / Admiral Croft / Captain Harville

Rocklin's own Rodger McDonald is a third-generation performer who hales originally from Los Angeles. He recently completed roles as Joseph Pulitzer in Newsies, Friar Laurence in *Romeo and Juliet*, Doctor Finache in *A Flea In Her Ear*, Ebenezer Scrooge in *Christmas Carol*, the lead in The Miser, Captain Hook in Peter Pan, and Judge Sorell, in The Seduction of Judge Thomas Sorrell at the Geery Theater, after directing Evita in which he played Peron for Runaway Stage. He has completed

his fourth season at Music Circus. At Woodland Opera House, he most recently directed Meet Me in St. Louis, Midsummer Night's Dream, The Miser, and A Flea In Her Ear. He has acted and directed in The Imaginary Invalid and has appeared as King Pelinor in Camelot, Cervantes/Don Quixote in Man of La Mancha, Father in Ragtime, Harold Hill in Music Man, and Higgins in My Fair Lady. With Runaway Stage he has performed as the lead in Dirty Rotten Scoundrels, the Pirate King in Pirates of Penzance, and Von Trapp in Sound of Music. With other local theaters he was Cladwell in Urinetown at River Stage, Captain Hook in Peter Pan at DMTC, and Capulet in Romeo and Juliet at Sierra Shakespeare.

He has performed with several major theater companies including the Alley Theater in Houston, Pacific Conservatory, Robert Redford's Sundance Theater, Rod Serling's Vooheis Theater in New York, Sherwood Shakespeare Festival, Utah Repertory, Solvang Theaterfest, Elizabeth Howard's Dinner Theater, the Great American Melodrama, the National Theaters of Guatemala and El Salvador and was selected for the Oregon Shakespeare Summer Shakespeare Company in 1978.



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He appeared as King James in the National PBS Drama, *Passionate Pilgrim*, and recently was featured in a new movie with Ellen Green and Kevin Corrigan which will debut in 2021. He has been awarded the Best Actor Award in the State of Utah, is a two time winner of Best Actor at BYU, where he both graduated and taught. He won a Los Angeles DramaLogue Award for *Macbeth* and performed in Europe and Asia with the USO as one of six members of the popular singing group "Collector's Item". Rodger is the winner of eight Chesleys and four Ellys with 18 Elly Nominations for Best Actor and Director. In 2015, Rodger was honored with the Lifetime Achievement Award presented by SARTA at the Annual Elly Awards in 2015.



ANNE MERINO – Mrs. Musgrove / Rose / Footman Cardiff / Viscountess Dalrymple

Merino began her career dancing for notable companies such as American Ballet Theatre and the London Festival Ballet. A prolific choreographer, she won the Vanguard Award for Choreography. Merino's traditional theatrical training was received at Chicago's Goodman Theatre, Second City with Del Close and Jim Belushi and later trained under Alan Rickman at the British American Drama Academy. As an actress, and former member of AEA, SAG/AFTRA, Ms. Merino performed with The Groundlings and Tim Robbins' The Actors' Gang and is a member of the theatre department faculty at William

Jessup University. As a writer, she recently won film festival awards for her screenplay, "The Season of the Wolf," and received critical acclaim for her recently released novel, **Hawkesmoor**.



JUDY MERRICK - Lady Russell / Mrs. Sophia Croft

Now a resident of Nevada City, Judy worked for 13 years in New York theater as a performer and director. Some of her professional performing credits include Portia in Merchant of Venice (Santa Monica Playhouse), Lysander in Midsummer Night's Dream (RADA), and Calpernia in Julius Caesar. She is the co-founder of the NYC theatre Company, The Amoralist, and her credits include The Cheaters Club (Abrons Art Center), Pied Pipers of the Lower East Side (Theater 80), Adam Rapp's Ghost in the CottonWoods (Theater 80), Happy in the Poor House and Bring Us The Head of Your Daughter (Gene Frankel Theatre). For Playwright's Horizon, she performed in The Bad and the Better, and performed in TACT

at the Manhattan Theatre Club. She also performed in Knuckleball, which performed in New York, San Francisco, London, and at the Edinburgh Fringe festival, for which she won best actress and the show won best play. She also performed in Adam Rapp's The Hallway Trilogy at the Rattlestick Theatre, off Broadway. Her education includes an MFA from USC, training at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts London, and graduate training at the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in NYC. Recently, Judy performed in Persephone's Tale with her new Nevada City theater company House of Fates, and currently teaches and performs improv with the House of Yes in Nevada City.



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STEVE CAMPBELL - Mr. Charles / Butler Merriman

A resident of Roseville, this is Steve's first production with Placer Repertory Theater. Audiences may recognize Steve from his role as Charlemagne in the McLaughlin filmed production of Pippin last year. Steve has also performed with Big Idea Theatre in Sacramento playing MacBeth in MacBeth and Enobarbus in Shakespeare's Antony & Cleopatra. She trained for a summer with Prague Shakespeare Company, where she performed Cassius in *Julius Caesar*. She also has a background in dance, devised movement, and crocheting. 
MATTHEW HEYER - Dialect Coach, Dr. Murphy / Mr. William Elliot



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
