This unique and whimsical episodic show features strange yet true history as audience members and professional actors influence an unpredictable adventure through space and time! The mastermind behind RIFTS IN TIME, T.S. Forsyth, hosts each episode and uses her storytelling skills, professional playwrighting background, and game master experience to delight audience members and performers alike!

Thanks to the engagement and feedback we have received, audiences at May's episode will enjoy minute yet crucial changes to RIFTS IN TIME intended to bolster its development -- the goal being to eventually merit the use of a theatrical space and theatrical lighting to further enhance its magic. The ever-evolving nature of this program parallels Placer Rep's internal motto of "never-ending improvement."





Audience members are also key performers at RIFTS IN TIME - From simply raising their hand to vote for what should happen, to suggesting an idea, to jumping up to perform one of the non-player characters in the storyline, their suggestions change the fates of our adventurers. To allow for such dynamic flexibility in RIFTS IN TIME, T.S. Forsyth prepares a dynamic digital storybook which allows her to adapt on the fly. "If a character dies, I can delete that character from the slides. If the performers go off the beaten track, I have extra slides for the variety of directions they might choose to go, plus various generic background slides that fit each month's show. There is always a slide I can turn to and storytelling and role-playing game elements I can employ to concoct unplanned moments based upon the dynamic twists served up to me, as storyteller, by my

collaborators -- namely the audience and the performers," said Forsyth.

We are enthralled to further develop this monthly program with the input of our patrons and the creative inspiration we engender in one another as participants. Come join us as we continue our journey and attempt to heal the Rifts in Time!
