#### Time & Place

Time and the nature of the universe are up for debate in this play. For staging purposes, since we "tiny humans" live in three dimensions and perceive time as linear and progressive, the story of the Dagmars takes place 30 years before, 20 years before and the day of "the incident," but not always in that order. There is a unity of place, but not of time.


