
Stage readings of early versions of a script are important to confirm the audience finds the characters interesting and the story compelling to make sure the project is worth the *thousands* of hours that will be spent developing and transforming the work to turn it into a professional mainstage world premiere.

As the playwright and director, this journey has taken a year from initial concept, through research of and visits to ten Placer County population areas, copious drafts, receipt of feedback from actors and multiple stage reading audiences, to the final lonely months of significant script development. I'm grateful for the opportunity to have met new partners and friends, and immersed myself in Placer County history, culture and its communities.

And now, as we rehearse, and add costumes, lights and sound to the production, this is when **theater magic** happens. All the months of hard work, generous support from partners, friends and the public add up to an emotional, meaningful, impactful night of theater for Placer County and its surrounding areas. This play shares our history, our triumphs and our struggles, as it depicts archetypal relationships, human experiences and catharsis. Bring a tissue for the touching final scene.

MAKING HISTORY. This mainstage world premiere is an historic event for Placer County and for Placer Repertory Theater. This production is not only Placer Rep's first multi-week mainstage production, but also Placer County's first opportunity to support its own professional regional theater company for a multi-week run of a new play on a mainstage. And that is set in and features stories from our area!
