## **GLOSSARY**

- Theme a lens through which we may examine the work
- Featured: an aspirational/inspirational video & discussion to start off the evening (live presenter on rare occasion) This is a nationally or world renown creative or speaker.
- Headliner: The presenter who begins the line-up, aligned with the theme of the evening.
  Goal: a "high-bar" local professional.
- Special Feature: A special guest, usually a "high-bar" presenter, that would normally be a headliner but is presenting later in the line-up.
