Placer Repertory Theater Resident Playwright Wins Fellowship; Stage Readings July, August

On the evening of June 29 as the Sacramento Region Community Foundation officially announced the Gloria Burt Sacramento Region Arts Fellowship 2022 recipients at an arts event in Sacramento, fellowship recipient Teresa Stirling Forsyth, Placer Repertory Theater's resident playwright and producing artistic director, stood before a Rocklin audience and performed a curtain speech to open the *Haunting History* show, which featured a stage reading of *Ghosts of Placer County*, the very project in development for which she is awarded the Gloria Burt Fellowship.

Ms. Forsyth responded to a call for Gloria Burt Fellowship applicants in May of 2022; a joint project of the Sacramento Alliance for Regional Arts (SARA), Blue Line Arts, and the Foundation that honors Gloria Burt, area arts advocate. Five Fellows were selected, including Ms. Forsyth, and the various projects supported include performance art, visual arts, electronic media, and literature. The *Ghosts of Placer County* project was selected from the literature category and will offer additional stage readings in July and August as part of its development.

Ms. Forsyth performed initial outreach to civic and governmental entities for historical research of ten Placer County population areas and developed drafts one and two of the new work, *Ghosts of Placer County*, supported in part by two Arts Council of Placer County individual artist grants. The Gloria Burt Fellowship will help defray development costs to bring this new work to its full fruition, including a professional quality digital recording of a production that may be shared with schools and libraries. "I am honored and humbled to be selected as one of the fellowship recipients," said Ms. Forsyth, whose prior plays have toured nationally and internationally to venues including the Kennedy Center.

According to the playwright, *Ghosts of Placer County* is a dark comedy about how individual and community history haunts us and how we haunt history to define ourselves. "It is also about how important it is to document history and pass knowledge down through the generations," said Kevin Foster, who plays Trailblazer guide Kenny Greene in the show. The play also explores relationship dynamics, and the evolution of a mother/daughter relationship even as it celebrates the contributions of both indigenous and immigrant populations within Placer County.

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The stage readings and table readings of this play in development are being helped along by a talented local cast of professional actors. Anne Merino stars as Dr. Dessa Dagmar. Anne is an adjunct faculty member for William Jessup University who received her theatrical training at Chicago's Goodman Theatre, Second City with Del Close and Jim Belushi and later trained under Alan Rickman at the British American Drama Academy. The cast is rounded out with Katherine Stroller, AEA actor/writer/character movement coach, Brennan Villados who you may have seen at Freefall Stage, Celebration Arts or Big Idea Theater, and Ari Knyazev, recently the lead in the State Theatre Acting Company's production *The Game's Afoot*.

The next opportunities to see stage readings of scenes from this play are at the July 27 and August 24 ColLABoration LABs, 401B Vernon Street in Roseville at 7 PM. With an MFA in Dramatic Arts and an MS in Business Management & Leadership, this former Silicon Valley high-tech VP and critically acclaimed professional director/playwright also plays the role of Producing Artistic Director for Placer Repertory Theater. KATHERINE STROLLER – Haunting History performer


